Paul was born in London, England and moved at the age of 7 years old to Canada. He brought with him the British sense of humour like no other. Paul was hilariously funny, kind, thoughtful, generous, sharp, extremely curious about everything and was committed to his work.

Paul started his young life in Lynn Valley in North Vancouver, making friends, getting into trouble and all that fun stuff that kids do. The family moved to Langley, where he went to Langley High school and drew many more friends into his circle. Paul started to work at age 14, fueling and washing planes at the Langley airport. He used all the money he made to pay for his flying lessons. After getting his pilot's licence at Skyways he became a flight instructor for about a year.
