


REMEMBERING Marlene Magdalene Wietzke (Marly)

Marly spent many years as an administrative assistant, most recently with the Canadian Department of Immigration before leaving the office to pursue what brought her the most joy which was caring for the children of many families. Marly trained as a Soul Midwife (holistic end of life companion) in 2014 in the UK. When she received her diagnosis this past December, she asked the Soul Midwives from her training group to gather around her for support. The group connected daily with Marly through healings, readings and song. A beautiful handcrafted felted tulip shaped urn for Marly's ashes was also commissioned and posted to Canada as a farewell gift.
