He thoroughly enjoyed helping many customers, young and old, for over 20 years.

He passed on this sense of adventure to his entire family and encouraged them to always be open to new experiences and to follow their dreams. Bob passed away on June 15, 2018. He will be missed greatly by his family: wife, Helen, children Laura (Bern), Erin (Andre), Dave (Cheryl), and grandchildren Sid, Lila, Sam, Josie, Ryan and Callum, as well as his extended family and friends, including some that go back as far as elementary school. He was predeceased by his only brother, Gerry, in 2011. Gerry's wife, Ola, who Bob affectionately referred

to as "my big sister", as well as her children, Natalie and Chris and their families, also share our loss.
